### Workshops

The workshops are entrusted to guest teachers and artists, and are a great opportunity to exchange ideas with personalities from the jewellery world, which offer their point of view and suggest research paths that will certainly constitute a further reflection tool for YOUR professional growth.

### Intensive courses

These courses are conducted by school's teachers, offering the opportunity to acquire in a short period of time professional skills, and are suitable for people who do not have the opportunity to take longer courses, perhaps because they have a job, or because they attending other schools.

### Flash courses

Very short courses, from 1 to 5 days long. They are taught by LAO teachers, technicians and assistants, the contents are purely technical and provide a demonstration phase by teachers and a phase of experimentation by the students.

## Workshops

David Loepp

Granulation – An intensive course on the craft of ancient joining techniques

The goal of the workshop is to teach the basic skills of ancient joining techniques and the strategies used to make artistic artefacts in the past with an eye on using these skills to design and fabricate contemporary objects. While the technique of granulation requires long-term repetition to develop proficiency and mastery, the basic skills and insights gathered during the course will prepare the participant to continue in autonomy.

Brooches are Bridges

They hold together, connect, link, merge as well as they control, check and supervise.

We play with the image on different levels: In a technical, and philosophical way.

Bridges are the result of human efforts to relate and connect two topographic locations permanently said Georg Simmel in "Bridge and Door". I would like to include fixed installed draw- or swing bridges and skywalks, balconies and stairs as well.

In addition, ladders are interesting for our considerations even if they are only temporary bridges. Just because of that reason, they come very close to the character of brooches.

Brooches in their original function as fibulas are connecting different parts of textiles and have a temporary character. You can fix and remove them easily. In this case, the connected textiles separate themselves and the brooch gets the character of an independent object.

In the workshop we approach to the topic from different directions:

- 1) Bridges as an idea and creative template for brooches. Everyone brings the idea of his/her favorite bridge. Spontaneous models will be made with limited material, drawings, sketches.
- 2) We investigate connections as temporary attachments between different materials or objects. Experiments with the mechanism of fastenings. Examination of relevant connections in everyday objects.
- 3) Design of a brooch with an integrated fastening as a part of the independent brooch object. We study traditional craftsmen mechanisms and explore extraordinary solutions.

## Artists short CV

David Loepp was born in 1951 and grew up in Wyoming. In 1969 he moved to Paris. Three years later he moved to Sicily where he apprenticed as a goldsmith and sculpture. Fascinated by ancient jewellery, he worked primarily with the exponents of "archo-gioielleria" in Messina and Rome where he opened a workshop in 1996. He has worked in experimental archaeology for the past two decades in collaboration with the University of Rome la Sapienza, Italy's National Research Council and the Antiquitates Center for Experimental Archaeology in Civitella Cesa.

Long-term projects in experimental archeology include:

The refining of gold and thermodynamic characterization of the process based on evidence from Sardis and the interpretation of textual sources;

Characterization of the color phenomena of shakudo;

Ancient strategies for the reduction of chalcopyrite ores and the winning of copper;

Joining methods in antiquity.

Tasso Mattar studied sociology at the University of Cologne (1969-75) and jewellery design at the University of Applied Arts at Pforzheim (1975-79).

He was well noted for his thematic exhibitions. We remember his bone exhibition "jewellery in a butchers" 1986, which became a legendary jewellery event. This presentation of the "precious" in the "trivial world" is a model of Mattar's special aesthetical approach which includes everyday objects as well as everyday life.

His artwork from bone, concrete, soapstone, amber, granite etc. are collected by museums and private collections. He directed workshops in Singapore, Israel, Finland, France, Switzerland, Germany and Luxembourg.

He lives and works in Artà/Mallorca, a small village in Spain.

## *Intensive Courses*

The intensive courses are held by the school teaching staff. Courses are of a prevalently technical content, open to all and they are generally attended by people with professional commitments who cannot attend the long-term courses, and students from other schools.

Lessons are held in Italian.

### INTENSIVE JEWELLERY DESIGN COURSE

**LAO** is the best place in Italy where you could learn about techniques and concepts of jewellery design. The intensive Jewellery Design course is recommended both for beginners and students in jewellery making and design, and it is also suited for professional goldsmiths who want to improve their competences.

To access this course it is not necessary to have drawing skills: the whole program will be carried out starting from basic notions, within everyone's reach. The use of watercolours for the realization of jewellery rendering is a refined technique, which requires time and patience, but ensures exciting results and offers future designers the opportunity to show their customers a realistic preview of how the object will be made. At the same time, we examine the technical characteristics for the design of different types of jewellery, such as rings, bracelets, earrings, necklaces, with and without stones. The last phase foresees the possibility to elaborate some project ideas for the future realization of coordinated sets of jewels.

**Study subjects:** technical drawing, design, rendering.

### INTENSIVE CAD COURSE

CAD technology allows us to visualize, modify and archive all the ideas, sketches and designs we like and at the same time help us create perfect prototypes in a relatively short amount of time. The intensive course is recommended both for beginners and advanced students in jewellery making and design, and it is also suited for professional goldsmiths who want to improve their competences.

**Study subjects:** Rhinoceros e Flamingo.

### INTENSIVE STONE SETTING COURSE

The intensive stone setting course is recommended both for beginners and students, but it is also suited for professional goldsmiths and stone setters who want to improve their competences with the newest techniques

The lessons are all held in the laboratory, and include demonstrations and exercises that will cover all phases of the setting of gems on metal, with the use of semi-finished silver and synthetic stones, predominantly cubic zirconia of high quality, perfect imitation of the stones precious. The techniques taught are those related to the great Florentine tradition, traditional and contemporary. Starting from relatively simple embedding techniques, such as the one on griffe and on bezels, you will soon arrive at more complex works, such as pavé.

**Study subjects:** stone setting workshop, lessons and exercises with silver findings and stones.

### INTENSIVE HAND ENGRAVING COURSE

Tuscany has always prided itself on being the centre of the refined art of engraving precious metal, in which the technique and the pleasure of ornamentation coexists in the most admirable way.

The school offers two courses:

#### - Course in plate engraving

This course concerns the engraving on flat plate, for the realization of decorative drawings, matrices for prints, objects of use (frames, boxes, etc.). The exercises will be done on brass and silver plates.

#### - Engraving course on Jewels

This course includes exercises on semi-finished casted pieces (rings, pendants, bracelets), in pinchbeck and silver, which will allow you to learn a difficult and refined art, able to transform a simple object into a small work of art.

The plate engraving course is open to all, while for access to the jewellery engraving course it is necessary to have attended at least one course on plate engraving, or in any case have basic skills in engraving

## FLASH COURSES

These are very short courses, from 1 to 5 days long. They are taught by LAO teachers, technicians and assistants, the contents are purely technical and provide a demonstration phase by teachers and a phase of experimentation by the students.

Classes are generally held in Italian language, unless specified otherwise in the schedule.

Admission requirements: please refer to the level indicated for each course in the calendars table.

Candidates judge for themselves which courses they can access, based on their skills.

The instructors will not be able to fill any technical gaps of the participants, except for the topics provided by the individual courses.

Knowledge of Italian or English is also required.

Groups of students from the same country can ask to arrange lessons in their mother tongue: the school will provide an interpreter at the expense of the group.

The Flash courses can also be activated on requests by small groups for specific programs.

## MATERIALS AND TOOLS

The school provides (included in fee) all the useful big tool for collective use. School also provide non precious metal, silver soldering, semi-finished products.

Pure silver and 925 in sheet and wire, are available to student, but are not included in the participation's fee. At the end of the workshop, the students will reimburse the cost of the used metal to the school.

Students for practical courses and workshops should bring their own tools (tongs, files, bow and blade, sandpaper, welding clamps, all instruments for design, and anything else considered useful).

To have a detailed list of tools needed for the courses you are enrolled, please contact the school office.

In town there are shops where you can buy tools and metals needed for the course.

The school can provide a tool kit for people who cannot bring their own tools.

A security deposit of 200 Euros will be paid by the arrival, and will be refunded at the end of the seminar, after the return of the full kit.

Damaged or broken tools will be reimbursed to the school.

### Furthermore:

Workshop with David Loepp

Sable brushes 2/0 and 3/0 (martora);

Instruments for measuring and designing: Dividers, rulers (straight edge), calibrators, scribes, machinist square;

Fine grain sanding paper 400 to 1000 grit;

Magnifying equipment: loupes, optivisor.

Pure metal: at least 15 grams Au 999\*.

\*A supplementary portion of pure gold may be supplied by the school for practice. Supplied pure gold must be full returned or purchased at the end of the course.

Carbon block: is supplied by the school, and is included in the course' fees. Participants can bring with them the carbon block after the seminar.

Keum-Boo course

Each participant must bring 1 gram of pure gold to carry out their projects

## NOTES

### \*\*Entry level (suggested)

For each course, the school suggests the level of preparation needed to achieve maximum results.

Teachers and instructors will not be able to spend extra time with students who do not have the indicated skills level.

A) Suitable by everyone

B) Beginners: little or no experience. First and second year students.

C) Intermediate: if you already have skills, these courses will be useful for your next step towards a more independent practice.

D) Advanced: courses suitable only for people in possession of professional requirements or at least three-year studies.

For the participation to the workshop with David Loepp, please note as follow:

- Familiarity with the blow pipe torch and/or blowpipe;
- Basic knowledge of metallurgy, notably the properties of metals and the preparation of alloys.

For those who need to learn how to use the pipe torch and have basic information on the preparation of gold alloys, the school can organize a day of training and lessons.



## ENROLMENT

To book the course(s), students must

- 1- Fill out the [on-line enrolment-form](#); Please, register separately for each course.
- 2- Send a copy of "proof of the Enrolment fee payment", by mail to the school secretary, to guarantee the enrolment in the course.

### Enrolment fee

(first instalment)

The candidate must pay 50% of the total amount at the time of enrolment.

Enrolment is complete only after proof of first payment is received.

Registration for two or more courses: please, pay in full the registration fee for the chosen courses (50% of the fee for each course). The secretariat will make a 5% discount on the second course, and 10% on the third course, when the balance will be paid.

Following Payment (balance of course's fees):

The balance of 50% must be paid by the first week of the Intensive Courses, and by the first day of lesson for the Workshops, as per the school secretary's instruction.

Note on discounts for students and alumni. To register you must pay 50% of the whole fees. The discount on the total cost will be made at the time of the payment of the fees' balance.

### Cancellation Policy

In order to receive the 50% reimbursement, a registered letter *must* be received by this office 30 days *prior* to the beginning of the course. Bank or postal fees are not included in reimbursement.

No refunds will be given without 30 day notice.

Cancellation by the school or teacher.

In case of cancellation, the school will immediately refund the amount paid, at no cost for the students.
